If problems in your life are building up, relationships difficult or feelings of sadness are affecting your life, there is help available at Prairie Counseling Center (PCC). We are aware that seeking assistance and treatment for yourself or talking to someone about a loved one's problem with alcohol or drugs can be difficult. PCC is a community behavioral health clinic providing mental health and substance abuse services in Bond and surrounding counties.

Persons served, families, and significant others will feel a sense of ownership and empowerment regarding treatment via their involvement in the treatment planning and implementation process.

PCC services are confidential and private. We will not identify a



person as a consumer and/or release information about a consumer without written and informed consent from the consumer, life-threatening circumstances may be an exception.
